



Dear Prison Representative:

NationsUniversity is pleased that you would consider recommending the school to those who are incarcerated. To that end, we have conveniently placed appropriate materials on the Internet that you can download and print out for distribution.

We do request that you distribute materials in a discriminate manner. It serves no purpose to register a student who does not understand the nature of the NU program or who is not serious about study.

- The person encouraged to enroll should understand that NU materials are college level. They are intended for the person who is searching for a program that can potentially lead to a college degree. The normal admission policy is a high school diploma or G.E.D.
- The program is designed for the person who wants to engage in religious studies. NU does not offer a degree in any other field.
- The program functions best when the prospective student is a person of special interest. This means that you are willing to assume responsibility for transferring the students registration into an electronic registration—you actually take his information and input the data onto a registration page on the NU website. And, you are willing to encourage the student during his/her studies and to proctor his/her examinations.

A proctor is one who receives the students exams, administers them, and returns the results to NationsUniversity.

The procedure outlined above is optimum. However, NU will service students who learn about us second and third hand through the passing on of a brochure and independent mail-in registration.
