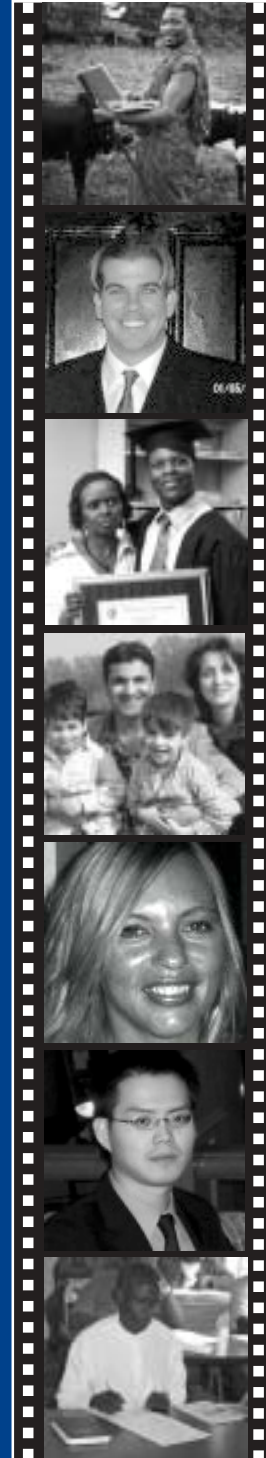

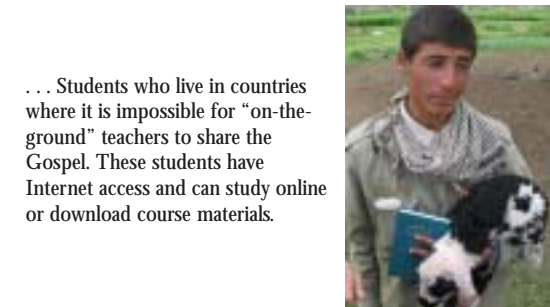

## Who are our students?

... Christopher, a student who lives in Zimbabwe. He works with a church in Nyanga. He is the father of four and is shown in the photo with his wife and three of their children in front of their home. Christopher literally sold the shirt off his back to get the money for postage to return his exams to NU.



... Jimmy, a student incarcerated in an American prison. His story went from one of despair to hope because of God's love and grace and a mother who never gave up on him. About NU Jimmy writes, "There is life after prison. NationsUniversity is one way of starting that new life."



... Students who live in countries where it is impossible for "on-the-ground" teachers to share the Gospel. These students have Internet access and can study online or download course materials.
